Admission Criteria:	Patients must:  Be 18 years of age or older.  Be medically stable.  Have a recent onset (less than one year) and a diagnosis of CVA or other neurological condition or a recent change in function related to this diagnosis.  Have a fully completed referral form signed by a medical doctor or nurse practitioner.  Have restorative potential to achieve defined functional realistic rehabilitation goals in an outpatient clinical setting with short-term, time-limited treatment.  Have the cognitive ability, tolerance level, and willingness to learn and participate.  Be able to access and manage transportation to BCHS for in person appointments.  Have a telephone and/or device with internet access and a webcam for virtual meetings if deemed the appropriate method of therapy.  Be accompanied by a family member, friend or attendant, if it is necessary for achieving the patients rehab goals and to assist with bowel and bladder management in the clinic.					
Exclusion Criteria:	Patients will not be accepted to the program when:  They require a bedded level of care.  They have behaviors that may interfere with or limit participation in rehabilitation for themselves and others.  They are unable to attend regularly scheduled appointments.  They have already participated in outpatient rehabilitation for the same condition and have no new functional goals.  They have received recent inpatient rehabilitation for their condition but have not demonstrated progress towards goals (restorative potential unlikely).  They are receiving services in the community for the same diagnosis/functional goals.  They require a maintenance level program as defined by the Rehab Care Alliance.  They are receiving therapy services that are covered by their extended health plans, WSIB, or MVA insurance.  They currently reside in a long-term care facility.
