Brant Community Healthcare System (BCHS) is a 260-bed acute care facility boasting stable, state-of-the-art Programs within a team environment and with a dedicated staff that ensures high-level, patient-focused care. The organization comprises of two main hospital sites, the Brantford General Hospital and Willett Hospital. Located in the picturesque Grand River Valley 20 minutes west of Hamilton, our community offers outstanding recreational opportunities.

BCHS is the area's acute care facility, providing all of Brantford and Brant County's specialty programs and services for our 120,000+ residents. We are the regional centre for paediatrics, mental health, obstetrics and gynaecology, critical care, surgery, and emergency medicine. We are also the District Stroke Centre for Brant, Haldimand and Norfolk regions. BCHS is a satellite site of the Hamilton Regional Cancer Centre providing an onsite daily cancer clinic along with a dialysis unit as a part of the St. Joseph's Healthcare Hamilton hemodialysis program.

We are currently recruiting for an **Interventional Radiologist** to join our Diagnostic Imaging Department to support our growing department. This position represents an opportunity to join a group of dedicated radiologists and nuclear medicine physicians. The department performs over 150,000 exams per year with anticipated growth to over 170,000 exams by the end of the year. This position is being created to support the installation of a second CT scanner in the organization slated for the summer of 2022.

The successful candidate will be supporting the expansion and augmentation of existing IR procedures within the organization. Areas of particular interest include percutaneous urologic interventions, vascular access, trans-vaginal/rectal drainages, percutaneous gastrostomy, and tunneled lines and biopsies, including lung. The successful candidate will be leading the expansion of services in these areas. Rotation through the other DI services of general reporting, CT, ultrasound and MRI is expected. Expertise in Nuclear Medicine is not required.

Interested physicians must have independent practice license from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario and a Royal College Fellowship in Interventional Radiology. Excellent interpersonal skills and a commitment to an inter-professional care model are also essential.
