

## Locum Tenens Pediatrician Brant Community Healthcare System

Brant Community Healthcare System (BCHS) is a 260-bed acute care facility boasting stable, state-of-the-art Programs within a team environment and with a dedicated staff that ensures high-level, patient-focused care. The organization comprises of two main hospital sites, the Brantford General Hospital and Willet Hospital. Located in the picturesque Grand River Valley 20 minutes west of Hamilton, our community offers outstanding recreational opportunities.

BCHS is the area's acute care facility, providing all of Brantford and Brant County's specialty programs and services for our 120,000+ residents and boasts stable, state-of-the-art programs within a team environment that ensures high level patient-focused care. With over 63,000 ER visits, 1,400 births, a level 2B special care nursery, and 300+ beds at the Brantford General Hospital, plus over 16,000 urgent care visits and 32-beds at The Willett, BCHS is also an affiliated teaching site of the McMaster University Michael G. DeGroote School of Medicine.

We are currently recruiting for Locum Tenens Pediatrician to join our Brantford General Hospital Department of Pediatrics. The pediatrician will be providing care to support a level 2B NICU, 8 bed pediatric inpatient unit, an associated bilirubin clinic and acute referral clinic, known as the Pediatric Acute Referral Service (PARS), as well as provide assessment of well newborns. They will be expected to provide pediatric consults to the Emergency Department including facilitating the Pediatric Quick Care Program. They will be expected to attend high risk deliveries and see consults from local midwives and family physicians.

This position represents an opportunity to join a group of dedicated healthcare professionals in a progressive organization. Interested physicians must have independent practice license from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario and a pediatric fellowship from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or equivalent (e.g. American Board). Successful candidates will also need to have up to date neonatal resuscitation program (NRP) and pediatric advanced life support (PALS) certification.

As a McMaster University Mac-CARE teaching site for the Grand Erie Six Nations, the successful candidate would be expected to participate in teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate medical learners thus excellent interpersonal skills and a commitment to an interprofessional care model are also essential.
