# CARE AT HOME AFTER ARTHROSCOPIC KNEE SURGERY (Dr. Hickey)

### How you might feel after your operation

- You may feel nauseated, light headed, dizzy or sleepy for up to 24 hours after your surgery
- You may have a slight temperature for a day or two
- You may feel tired for a few days after your surgery
- Make sure you have a responsible adult stay with you for 24 hours

For 24 hours after your surgery do not.... Drive a vehicle

Operate heavy equipment
Drink alcohol or smoke
Make any important decisions

#### **Incision Care**

- Remove your bulky dressing on the 4<sup>th</sup> day post-operatively unless you are told differently from your surgeon.
- If you have steri-strips on your incision sites, leave them on until they fall off on their own (usually 7-10 days)
- Some swelling of your leg and foot is common. Keeping your leg elevated on pillows when you are resting will help with this.
- An ice pack on your knee (20 minutes on and 20 minutes off) several times a day will help with the swelling and discomfort.
- Be as active as you can within the limits of your discomfort. If the pain increases, slow down on your activity for a day or two.
- Avoid squatting and twisting your knee around for at least two weeks. This allows for healing to happen.
- Check your leg and foot for circulation changes frequently. This includes numbness, tingling or colour changes. Wiggling your toes and moving your foot around helps with your circulation.

#### Pain and Medication

- Your surgeon will give you a prescription for pain relievers. Take them as instructed by your pharmacist.
- You may take your regular medications again when you arrive home

#### Nutrition

Eat light foods for the first day such as tea, toast, soup and jello. Drink lots of fluids. You may increase
your foods as you feel better.

## **Activity and Exercise**

- Rest for the first day when you get home. By the next day you will feel more able to move around.
   This improves circulation and speeds recovery.
- Your surgeon will let you know when to return to work
- Contact your surgeon's office to arrange for a follow up appointment. Sometimes you are given a follow up visit time on the day of your surgery.
