

Brantford Brant Health Professionals Update

March 15, 2020

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Key messages:

- No confirmed COVID-19 cases locally
- When in doubt, self-isolate
- COVID-19 testing is being prioritized and is not required for the entire population
- BCHS Assessment Clinic is open (not walk-in)
- Patients: CALL AHEAD if COVID-19 concern

SURVEILLANCE UPDATE: COVID-19

As of 1030 on March 15, there are 142 COVID-19 cases in Ontario. There are <u>no confirmed</u> <u>cases in Brantford Brant</u>.

SELF-ISOLATION GUIDANCE

The following groups need to self-isolate and are <u>considered a probable case</u> of COVID-19:

- Fever over 38 C and/or new or exacerbation of a chronic cough AND any of the following within 14 days prior to onset of illness:
 - Have travelled to an impacted area or been in close contact with a confirmed or probable case or;
 - Been in close contact with a person who has an acute respiratory illness and has travelled to an impacted area.

Additional self-isolation criteria:

- Those who have recently travelled to Italy, Iran and Hubei, China are asked to selfisolate even if asymptomatic.
- Any children who have travelled outside of Canada are required to self-isolate for 14 days upon return.

ASYMPTOMATIC RETURNING TRAVELLERS

Asymptomatic travellers returning from travel outside of Canada are not eligible for COVID-19 testing.

At this time, the Government of Canada is asking all travellers coming into the country to self-isolate for 14 days.

COVID-19 TESTING CRITERIA

Updated Ministry testing guidelines include the following groups:

- Symptomatic contacts of confirmed cases
- Individuals admitted to hospital with acute respiratory illness
- Health care workers with acute respiratory illness
- Individuals with acute respiratory illness who reside in long-term care or retirement homes
- Individuals with acute respiratory illness who reside in other institutions and as directed by local public health officials
- Health care workers as part of a health care institutional outbreaks as directed by local public health officials
- First Nation Community members living on reserve with acute respiratory illness

Individuals not falling under these groups, but meeting the probable case criteria, will be recommended to self-isolate without having testing completed for COVID-19 and will be considered a probable case and be reported to the Health Unit.

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COVID-19 ASSESSMENT CENTRE AT BCHS

Beginning March 14 at 0900, the Brant Community Healthcare System opened an assessment centre for non-emergent, non-acute patients presenting with potential COVID-19 related acute respiratory infection.

It is located at the D-wing entrance and open Monday-Friday 0630-2100 and on weekends 0900-2100.

Please note: the BCHS Assessment Centre is not a walk-in clinic. Referrals can be made from primary care based on the testing criteria (i.e., through telephone screening). Call 519-751-5818 for more information.

WHO TO CALL AND WHEN

Residents have been advised of the following if they have concerns about exposure to COVID-19 or have new symptoms related to COVID-19.

- Call Telehealth Ontario at 1-866-797-0000
- Call Brant County Health Unit at 519-753-4937
- Call their health care provider
- Call 911, if there is an emergency
- If planned to go to the emergency department, call ahead to 519-751-5818

It is recommended that all automated phone and email messaging at primary care facilities direct patients who are concerned about COVID-19 exposure to Telehealth Ontario at 1-866-797-0000.

IPAC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PPE

Public Health Ontario has released updated IPAC recommendations for use of personal protective equipment (PPE) for care of individuals with suspect or confirmed cases of COVID-19.

Droplet and Contact precautions are recommended for the routine care of patients with probable or confirmed COVID-19.

Airborne precautions should be used when aerosol generating medical procedures (AGMPs) are planned or anticipated to be performed on patients with probable or confirmed COVID-19.
